Volunteer or Internship Position Description

## *Position & Responsibilities*

---

### **Role Summary**

This position provides in-home or in-community advocacy services, safety planning, goal planning, and connections to resources to young people of all genders between the ages of 13 and 24 in the east metro area who have experienced (or are at risk of experiencing) relationship violence, sexual assault or exploitation, stalking, and homelessness.

### **Impact & Benefits**

- Gain experience in youth advocacy, providing support and resources throughout the community
- Implement strength-based methods to serve youth, young adults, and families
- Use your organizational and communication skills to make a difference in someone's life

### **Position Responsibilities**

- Travel to meet clients in their home or in the community to discuss safety, goal planning, relationships, and other issues
- Independently enter client information into database
- Correspond with other service providers/agencies in the community to promote the program
- Participate in biweekly client consultation meetings

## *Qualifications & Expectations*

### **Position Qualifications:**

- Experience working with youth and/or young adults
- Ability to work with diverse teams and clients to foster a culturally inclusive environment
- Ability to build trusting relationships with clients while maintaining appropriate boundaries
- Ability to communicate respectfully and respond appropriately to youth and adults while maintaining client confidentiality at all times
- Must have reliable transportation

### **Time Commitment & Availability**

- 10-20 hours per week with a minimum commitment of three months

### **Supervision & Training**

- Attend Tubman's five part Volunteer/Intern Orientation and Training Series
- Supervised by the Safe Journeys Shelter Manager
