





# **ABOUT TUBMAN**

Our mission is to advance opportunities for change so that every person can experience safety, hope, and healing.

As a multiservice organization, in 2023 Tubman helped about **18,400 people** of all ages, genders, and cultural backgrounds who **faced relationship violence**, **sexual exploitation**, **homelessness**, **addiction**, **mental health challenges**, and other forms of trauma.

## 2023 SERVICE HIGHLIGHTS

Support in Crisis: 11,834 people in crisis accessed support and resources by phone or in person.

**Safety Plans: 5,969 people** developed a safety plan by phone or in person.

Shelter & Housing: 244 adults and their 274 children received safety and support at our domestic violence shelter. Safe Journeys provided transitional housing and supportive services for 33 youth and their 7 children. Rapid rehousing programs helped 58 youth and adults and their **34 children** secure and sustain housing in the community, with rental assistance and wrap-around services.

Legal Services: 3,105 clients received 12,869 services including victim advocacy, legal information, advice or representation in Orders for Protection and family law, or helpline support on legal matters.

Mental & Chemical Health Services: 595 clients accessed addictioninformed mental health support in our licensed clinics.

School-Based Prevention: 3,718 youth participated in our six week school-based violence prevention curriculum or attended a presentation on healthy relationships or violence prevention.

Youth Advocacy: 1,161 youth and young adults experiencing violence or exploitation received support or direct services advocacy in the community and in Tubman's housing and shelter programs.

Meeting Goals for Stability: 534 clients addressed their wellness. financial, employment, education, or housing goals, individually or in workshops.

Community Education: 2,043 professionals, students, and community members learned about Tubman's services, relationship violence, exploitation, and other topics and community events and presentations.
